Course descriptions

1. Working internationally in Helsinki Metropolia (5 ects)

XXXAB02 Finnish for Exchange Students, 3 ECTS

On completion of the course, the students are able to identify and use common Finnish words and grammatical structures, and cope in simple conversations in Finnish. They will also be familiar with features of Finnish culture.

Content: Finnish pronunciation, everyday conversations, basic structures and vocabulary. No previous studies or skills required.

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2. Innovation Project Studies 1 and 2 (10 ECTS)

XX00AC55 Innovation Project Studies, 10 ECTS

Innovative project work conducted in co-operation with working life and carried out in a multiprofessional teams.

Content of studies:

- Basics of project and innovation work: innovation, planning, implementation, evaluation, communication, publication, productization and marketing.
- Cooperation skills, working with interest groups and networks.
- Innovative work methods.
- Areas of collaborative development competence: development processes, coordination of development and its management, modification of development models.

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Each field, however, has specific oral and written exercises.

- self-assessing the language and communication skills and developing learning strategies
- education and career
- organizations, work environments, assignments, processes and instruments
- key interactive communication situations: individual and group communications
- professional texts, documents, and terminology: seeking, processing, and producing information.

SG00AA20 WORK PLACEMENT 3: Assessment and promotion of occupational performance and participation, 12 ECTS

Students plan and implement individual and group therapy processes. Students assess factors contributing to the occupational performance and participation of clients and the group and adjust their own actions as required. Students assess individual clients' occupation in groups and networks. They make use of assessment information in planning and instruction of occupational therapy. Students apply information in group situations and work in multidisciplinary teams. They adjust their own way of instructing and consultancy as required. Students document group processes. They make use of supervision and adjust their own way of instructing the group as required.





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
