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## Introduction to Furtwangen University of Applied Sciences

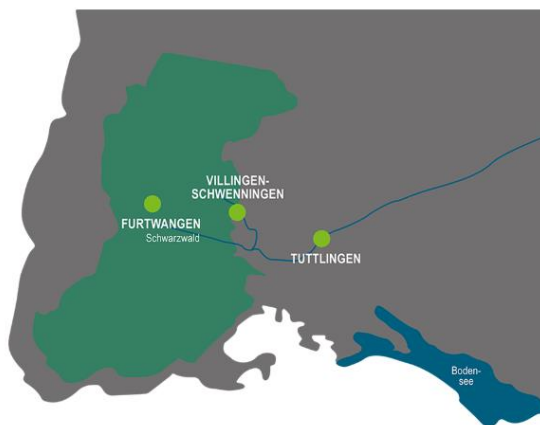
Furtwangen University (known by its German acronym “HFU”) focuses on applied learning and research in **mechanical engineering, information and media sciences, business and health sciences** — and has been ranked among Germany’s top universities in a number of these fields by major national publications and surveys conducted amongst students and employers.

With about 4600 **students**, the academic community is large **enough to** enjoy modern laboratories, a highly modern IT infrastructure, and one of Germany’s best science libraries, yet small enough to maintain a personal touch. Small class sizes, regular personal contact with the teaching staff, and an excellent learning environment help guarantee good results and a positive experience.

Students and staff also benefit from the large international population on campus, as well as the natural beauty of the surrounding regions, including Germany’s renowned **Black Forest**. The enormous range of activities on campus includes over 30 different sports, from skiing and climbing to tennis and mountain biking.

Students generally earn a bachelor’s degree within seven semesters, including a semester-long work placement and thesis. In addition, students gain experience through team-oriented project work, or during a study semester abroad at one of our more than 140 partner universities worldwide. Master degree programmes at HFU usually take three semesters to complete.

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## Practical Information

### Fall Semester Dates

Preferred Arrival Date	A few days before the Orientation Programme starts (late September)
Orientation Programme (incl. German intensive course)	One week before the start of lectures (attendance is mandatory)
Lecture Period (incl. exams)	Approximately 1 October to 25 February
General holidays	No lectures between Christmas (24 <sup>th</sup> December) and New Year's Day

### Spring Semester Dates

Preferred Arrival Date	1 March
Orientation Programme (incl. German intensive course)	One week before the start of the lectures (attendance is mandatory)
Lecture Period (incl. exams)	Approximately 15 March to 31 July
General holidays	There is a one-week break either at Easter or Pentecost

### Application and Nomination Process for Incoming Students

Nomination Deadline	For entry in the spring semester: 15 October For entry in the fall semester: 15 April
Application Deadline	For entry in the spring semester: 1 November For entry in the fall semester: 1 May
Nomination and Application procedure and required documents	Students must be nominated by their home institution by email (with the HFU nomination form) Students will then be contacted directly with further information about the application process (including application link) Students must apply online and upload the following documents: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• CV/resume</li> <li>• Passport-sized photograph</li> <li>• Subject and grade report, both in the original language and in German or English translation</li> <li>• Letter of motivation</li> <li>• Proof of English or German skills (at least B1)</li> </ul>

### Housing

The International Center provides accommodation for all exchange students. A 500 Euro reservation fee has to be made by the student. The reservation fee is fully refunded once the student arrives on campus.

Tuttlingen	Rooms are only available in private houses.

**Important:** Rooms can only be rented for a **6-month period** (March to August or September to February)! Rooms booked through the International Center in the above named SWFR dormitories for short rental period (one or two semesters) are charged a monthly supplement of 15 Euro. For rooms in private houses a liability insurance is normally required.

Cost of Living	
The monthly expenses for room and board in Germany, including health insurance, are estimated to be 934€. The cost of living in Furtwangen, Schwenningen, and Tuttlingen, however, is below that of most other university towns in Germany	
Academic System	
Contact hours	The academic programmes are structured in semester hours per week (Semesterwochenstunde = sws). One semester hour per week (contact hour) equals a lecture of 45 minutes for the duration of one semester. One semester usually consists of about 15 weeks.
Academic Credit	The workload of one semester corresponds to 30 ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer System).
Grading System	Grades range from 5.0 (minimum) to 1.0 (maximum) and 4.0 is the minimum passing grade. 2.5 is considered a good grade
Language of Instruction and Programmes for Exchange Students	
Language specification	Courses are offered in German and partly in English (not on Tuttlingen Campus!). Some degree-programmes are taught entirely in English. German as a Foreign Language	
German courses	German as a foreign language (DaF) is taught in 5 levels of proficiency as regular courses during the semester. The pre-term intensive course is only taught in level A1 and A2 <a href="#">German courses   Language courses - School of Languages and Culture (hs-furtwangen.de)</a>
Insurance	
Health Insurance	EU students must bring their EHIC (European Health Insurance Card). Non-EU students must take out a <b>German statutory health insurance</b> (cost around 100 Euro per month) or get an exemption

	<p>letter, which can be issued by a German statutory health insurance company if the student's international health insurance meets the requirements (which is usually not the case!).</p> <p>With one of the following service providers Expatrio, Fintiba, or Coracle students can take out the necessary statutory health insurance online from home.</p> <p>We strongly recommend that students take out a travel insurance for their flight and the first days in Germany before enrolment</p>
Accident Insurance	<p><b>Statutory Accident Insurance:</b> Students registered at a German accredited university are covered under the Social Act 'SGB VII'. Insurance cover is provided:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• during lectures and seminars</li> <li>• revision courses and field trips</li> <li>• public libraries</li> <li>• in different sports at the University</li> <li>• activities of the student body and other university related activities</li> </ul> <p>Accidents that occur on campus or on the direct route between home and university or during university sports must be reported to the University Secretary</p> <p><b>Leisure Accident Insurance</b> is provided by the Student Services Freiburg (see below).</p>
Liability Insurance	<p><b>Liability Insurance within university grounds</b> is provided by the Student Services Freiburg (see below)</p> <p><b>Private liability insurance:</b> We strongly recommend students to take out private liability insurance.</p>
<b>Fees</b>	
Exchange students from partner universities are exempt from paying the Administration fee and the Student Union contribution. However, they must pay the Student services fee.

<b>Visa and Residence Permit for Non-EU students</b>	
<p>Non-EU students must apply for a visa in their resident country.</p> <p>Students from certain Non-EU countries can enter Germany without a visa (please check the websites of the German embassy in your home country for details) and apply for a residence permit after their arrival in Germany.</p>	
<b>Services for International Students</b>	
Pick-up service	The International Center offers a pick-up service at the local bus stop/train station for exchange students from partner universities. Degree-seeking students in international study programmes should contact their respective programme coordinator
Buddy Programme	The International Center runs a Buddy Programme which arranges contact between German students and new exchange students. Before arrival, every exchange student can contact his/her buddy by email. A buddy is a German student who helps new international students to get to know what everyday life at university is like, especially at the semester start. Everyone knows how important the first impressions of a new town or a new

	country can be and how nice it is to have someone you already know when you arrive.
Orientation Programme and German Seminar	About one week prior to the beginning of classes, the International Center runs an Orientation Programme during which exchange students are provided with important information regarding their stay in Germany. They receive information and support in administrative matters (residence registration, enrolment, immigration etc.). Two weeks prior to the beginning of classes students can take part in an online German intensive course (for beginners at or below B1 level). For successful completion of this programme (including German language course) students can gain 3 ECTS.
Trips and Events	The International Center and the International Student Community (ISC) organize a number of trips and events throughout the year: a 3-day trip to Berlin, day trips to Heidelberg, Konstanz, Freiburg, Stuttgart and other places, cross-country skiing, hiking tours, international festivals, movie nights, country presentations and more.
